Program Summary

re_BOOTCMP is a cybercrime prevention program run by the AFP-led Joint Policing Cybercrime Coordination Centre (JPC3), in collaboration with Australian education providers, State & Territory Police and industry partners.

It caters to high school students, focusing on those who display a strong interest and aptitude in IT and may exhibit a curiosity towards exploring or crossing some online boundaries.

The one-day program, with follow up mentor/mentee engagement, aims to nurture and guide the talents of young, tech-savvy individuals towards positive and constructive use of their digital skills by teaching them the legal online boundaries and exciting career pathways for their skillsets.

The parallel half-day session for parents, carers, and teachers involves discussions from education and industry presenters about the ethical use of the internet and how to proactively support their child/student's passion for IT.

The Australian adaptation of re_BOOTCMP follows the success of the project by the Dutch National Police. It was successfully piloted in Sydney in March 2024 at Fortress E-Sports Arena with 18 student participants, nine parents, carers, and teachers, and 12 law enforcement, education and industry volunteer mentors.

The JPC3, in partnership with Tasmania Police and the Tasmanian Department of Premier and Cabinet, is expanding the pilot nationally, including **Hobart on 23 June 2025**.
